



Diggers FC Anti-Smoking Policy

Diggers Football Club recognises that passive smoking (inhaling second-hand smoke) is hazardous to health and that non-smokers should be protected from tobacco smoke. Passive smoking can lead to other serious illnesses such as bronchitis, lung cancer, cardiovascular disease, and chest illnesses in children. Accordingly, the following policy has been developed by Diggers Football Club to help protect people's health.

The move to go SmokeFree also complements Diggers Football Club's desire to create a healthy family friendly environment. Diggers FC believes that such an environment and image will be advantageous in attracting new members and positively promoting the club in the community.

Who is affected by this policy:

This policy applies to all members, administrators, officials, coaches, players and visitors of Diggers Football Club at John Cullen Park.

Anti-Smoking Policies

Diggers Football Club has incorporated the following policies in compliance with the anti-smoking Queensland Government legislation:

1. No smoking shall occur within 5 metres of the clubhouse entrances
2. No smoking shall occur within 10 metres of viewing and playing areas at organised under 18 sporting events. This includes both matches and training.
3. No smoking shall occur in or around the canteen area.
4. Smoking may only occur within the designated outdoor smoking area.
5. Coaches, official, trainers, volunteers and players will refrain from smoking and remain smoke free while involved in an official capacity.

Continual failure to comply with this anti-smoking policy will result in the offender being escorted from the premises.
